

I got a chance to sit down with Pat to learn more about his journey with Rush and the values that drive him forward.

A self-described "country boy" from West Virginia, Pat enjoys working out, fishing and shooting pool in his down time. "It's my stress relief", said Thornton. He also is a fan of the Pittsburgh Steelers, which will come as no surprise if you know Pat.

But above all, his heart lies with his family - a beautiful clan comprising his wife, 10 children (9 boys and 1 girl), and soon to be 28 grandchildren. He loves attending Church and praising the Lord with family.

Driving a tractor-trailer out of our Dayton terminal, Pat's journey with Rush strted as a box truck driver for an owner operator. Reflecting on his transition to the big rigs, Pat fondly recalls his favorite Rush memory when Steve Parker took a chance on him when "no one else would."

"Steve Parker sold me a box truck." Pat said smiling. He drove that box truck for about four years with Rush and then wanted a shot at the semis. He started driving a Huber Heights to Eaton route. "I was afraid to back up," he jokingly said, "that route started in a big parking lot, and ended in a big parking lot." Pat remembers that this was how he got comfortable behind the wheel. For Pat, Rush is more than just a job, it's filled with great people. From cookouts to last December's Holiday Party, he loves the people here and when we can all get together. "No one recognizes each other in street clothes." he laughs.

I asked Pat what advice he would give someone starting their career as a truck driver. "Never get comfortable," he advises, "after about 3-4 months you may start to slack on your pre/post trip inspections."

Pat goes on to say that drivers should know their trucks and ensure that everything is in good working condition. "You never know when something is going to break. Rush wants to be on time, but they want us to be safe."

Additional advice this seasond driver offered to other drivers was to rest and to take care of yourself.

"Make sure you pack a lunch or a dinner, you never know when you may get held up." Pat offers, "Also, stay clean, keep yourself and your truck clean."

What keeps Pat motivated after all these years? "I try to motivate myself by earning more money each week." he shares honestly.

And admidst the hustle and bustle of the road, Pat maintains a level head and advises other drivers to keep their cool. "Don't get frustrated, especially with dispatch. They have 100s of people they are talking to a day and we have no idea what they are going through." Pat also added that he would welcome dispatchers to come ride with him to see what drivers encounter throughout the day.

In closing, I want to thank Pat for his insights and dedication to Rush. His commitment to excellence and positive attitude serve as an example for all of us. Here's to many more miles of success on the road ahead!

The trucking industry is fascinating to study if you are interested in economics. This is because freight rates fluctuate based on the balance between available freight for shipping and the number of trucks available for delivery. When there is excess freight compared to the number of trucks, freight rates increase. Conversely, when there is a shortage of freight compared to truck capacity, freight rates decrease.

Freight demand is influenced by the economy, leading to cycles of rising and falling rates that can last for several months or longer. Remember 2020 during Covid? We experienced a period of low volumes and rates, followed by a rebound in the middle of 2021 when we saw a peak with unprecedented volumes and rates. Unfortunately, we've been dealing with low volumes and freight rates for the past 12 months now.

However, the trucking market is showing promising signs of returning to growth!

Summer Safety Tips

As we head into summer, soaking up the sun and the great outdoors, be aware of risks from damage and injuries caused by the sun, heat, water, or environmental accidents.

Staying safe is vital for all ages, whether you're spending the summer months at the pool, working in your yard, or taking a well-deserved vacation. Here are some safety tips to keep everyone in your family healthy and happy this summer.

Check the weather before you head out.

Summer weather can be unpredictable, but with easy access to technology, we can access weather updates easily. It's also a good idea to check out the UV index to ensure you can protect yourself from sun damage.

Wear sunscreen of SPF 30+ anytime you're outdoors.

The American Academy of Dermatology recommends using a SPF with broad spectrum protection against UVA and UVB, is water- and sweat- resistant, and has an SPF of 30 or higher. Use a shot-glass sized amount and reapply every 2 hours (or sooner).

Pack a waterbottle and first aid kit.

Staying hydrated is important, especially with increased outdoor

activities. Don't wait until you are thirsty to drink (that's a sign you are already low on fluids.) Limit sugary or alcoholic drinks outdoors, which can cause you to lose more body fluid. Your first aid kit should include items like bug spray and aloe vera.

Be vigilant about water safety.

Not only at the beach or pool, but non-swimming times as well. Always be aware of your suroundings and be especially attentive to watching your children around water.


Know the signs of heat exhaustion.

Dizziness, muscle cramping, weakness, fatigue, confusion, heart palpitations, and nausea are warning sign of heat exhaustion. If you notice these or any other feelings of being unwell, go indoors or find shade, drink water, and any other way to try to bring down your body temperature.

Never leave a child or pet in a vehicle unattended.

It only takes 2 minutes for a car to heat up to lethal levels. Never leave a child or an animal alone in a car at any time.
